Every Sheffield Child Articulate and Literate

Can you help?

For the last four years SU3A members have taken part in the ESCAL Volunteering Project, a Council initiative working to make the goal above a reality. Volunteers are linked with a school which has children who, through regular one-to-one sessions, can be helped to build up their levels of reading and communication and develop the confidence to play a full part and gain the most from their school experience.

Volunteers do not need to have qualifications or experience of teaching – grandparents, godparents or favourite aunts or uncles are probably already giving similar support – and some training and materials are provided. Minimum realistic time commitments are set but some volunteers have chosen to continue their involvement with their school, some even becoming governors. In arranging a link with a participating school, the Project will take account of your preferences for location etc.

Since SU3A first became involved the Project has expanded the age groups of the pupils targeted and the kinds of support volunteers can choose to offer. In the beginning the priority was preparing pupils in Years 5 and 6 for the challenges of secondary school. Now Junior Schools are asking for support for children from Reception up and the Project is also developing reading/talking support in Secondary Schools.

Tai Chi for Balance Disorders

An article in *Spin*, the magazine issued by the Ménière's Society, reports on a presentation given at its Annual Conference 2012 by David Barrow, Tai Chi Chuan Instructor. Ménière's Disease is a disorder of the inner ear characterized by vertigo and balance problems, deafness and tinnitus. The paper discusses a clinical programme at the Royal Hallamshire Hospital developed for patients with balance disorders.

The programme is an adaptation of the standard Tai Chi exercises to make them suitable for those with poor balance control. This 'Clinical Tai Chi' course lasts for 12 weeks and has been conducted at the Royal Hallamshire for the past ten years. Hundreds of patients have taken part, with approximately 90% reporting an improvement in their condition. The feedback from participants shows that, compared to pre-treatment, their perceived symptoms decrease after practising Tai Chi. Their feeling of well-being increases together with confidence level, and this encourages them to take part in a greater range of day-to-day activities than previously. Many patients join regular Tai Chi classes after the hospital course in order to benefit from a structured health exercise programme and to maintain improvements in their balance.

David Barrow and his senior student, Ken Thomas, conduct *standard* Tai Chi classes in Stocksbridge on Wednesday at 13:00 and Friday at 11:30. There are vacancies at the Wednesday class but only a limited number of spaces on the Friday session.

Minutes of the 26th Annual General Meeting held on 18 April 2012 at the Central United Reformed Church, Sheffield

Present: around 75 members, with Denise West in the Chair.

Apologies for absence: Peter Barclay, Pat Battams, Mike Brumby, Mary Cox, Cliff and Pat Crellin, Stephanie Dixon, Andrea Elson, Shirley Marney, Greta Pike, Harold and Joan Schofield, Sallie Swann, Beryl Toplis, George and Val Wiley, Barbara Woodthorpe.

1. Minutes of the 25th AGM

The Minutes of the AGM held on 18 April 2011 (previously circulated) were agreed as a correct record. Proposed: Steffon West, seconded: Barbara Robertshaw.

2. Chairman's Annual Report

2.1 The Annual Report had appeared in the April Links. The organisation nationally was expanding steadily, with 832 U3As and 273,679 members. The Yorkshire and Humber Region had approximately 6.5% of the total UK membership.

There were currently 2780 members in Sheffield U3A, 178 activity groups, and 6 open groups. The membership was slightly down from the previous year and it was thought the main reason for fairly new members not renewing was they were unable to get into the Groups or activities they wanted.

- 2.2 The Chair introduced the Development Plan for 2012/13. The main points mentioned were:
- The importance of communication with members. This was primarily through *Links*, the Drop-Ins and the website
- Renewals. The facility for sending out renewal numbers by email was going well and was cutting down on time and costs to the organisation
- Open Groups. New volunteers had been found to run the Classical Concertgoers and Literature Network
- New Members' meetings. There were now to be three a year. These meetings emphasised the self-help aspect and the need for volunteers
- There were two Coordinators' meetings a year and a buddy system had increased the flow of information from the General Coordinator. The Group Coordinators' web pages now included Advice Sheets issued by the Third Age Trust
- New initiatives. An open Group, Weekenders, had been introduced in January to provide activities at weekends and study days were being organised in conjunction with exhibitions at the City's art galleries and museums
- Publicity. New members were being sought through Outreach work and short talks at Pre-retirement courses. A DVD about SU3A had been commissioned for use in promotional work
- Intergenerational activities. These included involvement with ESCAL (Every Sheffield Child Articulate and Literate) and providing reading support volunteers in primary schools. The book *Lest We Forget*, published by SU3A in the last year would be sent to any Sheffield school which had World War II on its curriculum, if requested
- Links with other bodies. Contact was being maintained with both Universities, the Lifelong Learning Forum, Voluntary Action Sheffield and the U3A's Yorkshire and Humber Regional Committee.

The Chair thanked the Committee members, especially Vera Dyer, John Williams and Ken Stringfellow, who were stepping down and Mike Brumby, Independent Examiner of Accounts for the past 12 years, who was also stepping down. She thanked the Officers and the members who had worked tirelessly behind the scenes.

3. Treasurer's Report

The Treasurer introduced the Accounts for the year ended 31 December 2011 which had been circulated to members via the April issue of *Links*. He explained that the Independent Examiner's report had been slightly delayed and would appear in the June issue of *Links*. The Treasurer also thanked Mike Brumby for his work.

Generally, money had been saved against various items in the budget, including the lecture series and the Silver Jubilee event at Wortley. Sending out membership renewal numbers by email was also saving money on postage. Subscriptions were up slightly and Gift Aid had increased.

The accounts showed a larger reserve than was necessary and the Committee was looking at ways to reduce this, bearing in mind that Transitional Relief would end in the coming year, an upgrade of the Membership Records Officer's database was necessary and some of the Groups' central loan equipment would need renewing. The cost of the Lecture series would increase because eight lectures were planned for 2012 and funds would be required for the Regional event at Askham Bryan.

The Treasurer invited questions.

Derek Cave noted that the surplus on the year was c. £6,000, most of which was Gift Aid. The Government could end this scheme at any time and it was therefore necessary to ensure that the subscriptions covered running expenses.

The approval of the Accounts was proposed by Peter Digby and seconded by Shelagh Woolliscroft. Agreed by the majority.

4. Election of Independent Examiner of Accounts

Mike Brumby had now stepped down and it was necessary to appoint an Independent Examiner. The Treasurer appealed for anyone interested in volunteering for the role to contact him.

5. Elections to the Committee

There were two nominations and two vacancies to fill. The nominees introduced themselves and gave details of their careers and interests:

Jenny Emby: Proposed by Jean Stevenson and seconded by

Joan Maynard

Richard Morton: Proposed by Denise West and seconded by Pat

Battams

Both nominees were individually elected on a majority vote.

The meeting was asked to vote in the continuing members of the Executive Committee *en bloc*. This motion was agreed and carried by a majority vote.

6. Any other business

No matters had been formally notified in advance but various points were raised in an informal discussion.

- a) **Postage costs**. Anne Granville suggested sending out *Links* by email to members who chose to receive it in that form. The Chair said the Committee would consider the suggestion but the general feeling was that most members wished to receive the publication by post. Heather Walker suggested charging for a postal copy.
- b) Membership figures. Paul Wyman noted that membership was increasing in some U3As, e.g. Aughton and Ormskirk, whereas in Sheffield numbers were static, possibly because newer members could not get into suitable Groups. He pointed out that a large percentage of SU3A members lived in the Hallam area and met in people's houses: therefore the size of Groups was limited by the size of members' homes. He acknowledged the difficulty of finding reasonably priced central meeting rooms and reminded people to continue to look out for such venues. The Chair stated that the question of members' failure to get into Groups would be addressed in the coming year.

7. Introduction of new Regional Trustee

Anne Firth had stepped down as Regional Trustee for Yorkshire and Humber and David Morton had been elected. He introduced himself to the meeting and outlined the role of the Regional Trustee.

A Regional website had recently been set up and the SU3A website had a link to the Region's Newsletters. The details for Askham Bryan would appear in the next *Links*.

Annual Report. 2012/2013

Sheffield U3A's membership stands at 2830 members re-subscribing or joining for 2012–2013. We are, according to statistics, the biggest U3A in the country once again, still offering the widest range of activities as our interest Groups stand at 183, including seven Open Groups.

Financially, SU3A remains in a healthy state. Whilst the 2012 income was at the budgeted level we saved money on some items of expenditure. We regularly review our financial controls to minimise any risk of loss.

The £10.00 joining fee remains the same for this year. We have re-visited our Governance Paper and revised the job descriptions of all the officers making them more fit for purpose for a large and busy U3A. This includes a new addition, an External Liaison Officer, who represents us with outside bodies across the city. This is not a trustee post.

We planned and carried out Outreach work in the city in 2012. In March we did a promotion in Heeley Green and in October one in Sharrow. The results were mixed with Heeley Green by far the best in terms of new recruits for the organisation. Although overall disappointing we shall continue trying to reach potential members in areas of the city where we are under-represented. We did not appear in the local media in 2012 but are aiming for a higher profile in 2013. We continue to maintain publicity materials in libraries and can confirm that Sheffield City Libraries' management has offered us free space to have Outreach sessions in its libraries. Two community events were undertaken by our colleagues in the north and 12 presentations to pre-retirement courses across the city. We commissioned and assisted in the making of a 3 minute promotional DVD which will be a useful publicity tool. This can be viewed from our website and on YouTube.

The monthly Drop-In is now well established and performs many roles. Existing members use the Drop-In to socialise. New Groups meet and form there. Postgraduate students use them to recruit volunteers and potential members come to learn about the organisation. Overall it is an extremely useful venue and is always manned by many of the Executive Committee and willing volunteers.

We now have 3 New Members' Meetings per year. Feedback is very positive and we have swollen the volunteer list considerably with a comprehensive list of initiatives that members can sign up for.

Our Web Coordinator reports that visits to the website have increased and now average out at 180 hits per week. There have been a number of links added this year and we can boast it is the most up-to-date medium to find information about the organisation. Coordinators can download much of the updated and revised paperwork needed to organise their Groups and the information they return online can be disseminated quickly and efficiently.

Along with renewal of yearly subscriptions online via the website we have saved valuable time for our hard-working volunteers and money for the organisation as a whole. The "buddy" system between Groups is still working effectively and over 70% of the entire membership have registered an email address. We are now equipped to send one email to all members online. Having this facility means that in an emergency we can contact the majority quickly, thus giving valuable information and saving time and perhaps wasted journeys.

The *Links* magazine is in the middle of a major change. It continues to be produced and distributed bi-monthly but from February 2013 it has been in colour and on better quality paper. Changes in layout and content will appear over a number of editions and at the same time we are looking at streamlining methods of collection and stuffing as receiving a hard copy is still the most preferred method of delivery.

With over 183 different activity Groups and nearly 3,000 members the job of the General Coordinator is not an easy one. This year we have tried to lighten the load in two ways. The General Coordinator's database is now the responsibility of a Database Manager. She ensures the centre pages of *Links* are up to date and collects Group information by data collection emails. Being updated automatically saves time and eliminates entry errors. These tasks having been taken over has freed the General Coordinator's time to deal with the other demanding aspects of the job.

Popular topic Groups sometimes have waiting lists but these have been reduced considerably by the formation of new Groups. This year many different and interesting new ideas have also emerged and are taking shape as I write. The regular two meetings per year held for Coordinators have changed slightly. The autumn meeting is for new Coordinators only but the spring meeting is unchanged. We try to get as many Coordinators as we can to take part, be it to air concerns or gather information.

Currently we are in the process of forming two Shared Learning Projects with Sheffield University and Sheffield Hallam University, new ventures for SU3A. We look forward to working with other organisations and U3As sharing knowledge and being involved in a more in-depth learning experience.

Our intergenerational activities remain strong. We are still involved with Sheffield City Council and their ESCAL scheme where our members help with reading support in primary schools in the city. We also work alongside the Sheffield City Council Parks and Gardens Department in our Memorial Garden project at Whirlow Brook Park.

Our links with both Sheffield Universities have become much stronger this year. We have responded to over 30 students and postgraduates who requested help with their research and many of you responded to sit on the Ethics Committee of Sheffield Hallam University. In return, we have welcomed their academics who have lectured to us for free and we have also been invited to take part in Sheffield University's Practical Public Engagement initiative which gives us a voice and a higher profile in the community at large.

As a large U3A we have little opportunity to gather together in any numbers yet the social side of the organisation is just as important as the educational one. We have introduced more open Groups such as the Weekenders, held more lectures this year and trialled some short courses. All have proved popular. Some well-established Open Groups have recruited new Coordinators; others continue to be well supported and some events and holidays could be filled twice over.

Overall, SU3A continues to thrive. At a time when retirement and older age are at the forefront of national consciousness, it is good to see the quality organisation we have become and what we mean to our communities. None of this would happen without the hard work, dedication and commitment of its Trustees, Officers, Coordinators and volunteers. Together we have built an organisation of which we can be extremely proud.

Travel Group Visit to Four South Yorkshire Churches

Wednesday 17 July 2013: note the change from the advertised date


N.B. This will not be a repeat of the visits made in May and July 2012



Guided by Pat Mcloughlin, formerly of 'Heritage Inspired' and known to many of us, we will begin our four churches visits at St Peter, Conisbrough. This is the oldest building in Yorkshire, dating from the eighth century and with a medieval altar slab, piscinas, a sixteenth century font and medieval stained glass windows. There are also some furnishings by Robert Thompson, 'The Mouseman'.



From Conisbrough we will go to the church of St John the Baptist at Mexborough. The present church dates from the fourteenth century, with beautiful stained glass windows and stalls made by Robert Thompson. With the church restoration in 1890, the plaster and whitewash were removed from the North Aisle to reveal the Lord's Prayer and the Commandments.



Next we go on to All Saints, Wath upon Dearne, with its medieval roof bosses, including animal and human faces, an impressive reredos, Norman stone carved heads and abundant monuments. James Montgomery may well have worshipped in this church. We will have lunch here,



Leaving Wath, we will make our way to Wentworth, with its two churches, the old Holy Trinity Church, dating from the thirteenth century and the new church, commissioned by the Earl Fitzwilliam in memory of his parents. We will move from the medieval church, cared for by the Churches Conservation Trust, to the nineteenth century church, designed by the Victorian architect J. L.
