

Most open group activities require you to send in a booking form with deposit and S.A.E. The booking forms will be found in Links, in the Open Groups Supplement and in the monthly e-newsletter and should be completed and returned to the person named by the due date.

For the opportunity to learn more about our city, go on day trips, travel to Europe, listen to a lecture and meet new people, then one of the open group activities is for you.

Travel Audio System

To further enhance the tours where guides are used, Su3a have invested in the Whisper Audio System. Basically, you are provided with a small receiver (about the size of a pack of cards) which you wear around your neck. This has an earpiece attached. The guide wears a transmitter with a microphone and talks normally. Through your earpiece, you can hear the guide up to 70 metres away.

Ideal for those city walks or when visiting country houses and churches. For those with hearing aids with a 'T' switch, loop receivers are available. Just let the organiser know in advance.

If you prefer to use your own headphones or earpiece with a standard 3.5mm earphone jack (as used by mobile phones, tablets, and portable radios) then just take them with you on your journey.

Your tour organiser will let you know if these will be used on your excursion.

The rumours are true! The Steel City Wanderers series of walks will return in 2022. We intend to continue on from the previous, and excellent, Urban Adventures organised by Pat & Clare Ryan. Our aim is to arrange walks that are a little bit off the beaten track (ouch!) with wanderings devised around specific themes. Travel Group Visit to Fountains Abbey and Studley Royal 10 May 2022

We shall leave Sheffield between 07:45 and 08:00. There will be a short comfort break on route, arriving at Fountains Abbey around 10.30am. You can explore the visitor centre and top up with refreshments and then take the steep path to the ruins. There will be a tour of the Abbey at 11.30am. We will be departing the site at around 16.30pm, but this is flexible and depends on traffic on the day.

After the tour you will be at liberty to buy refreshments and then explore the grounds of Studley Royal and the Abbey ruins at leisure for the rest of the day.

Fountains Abbey belongs to the National Trust and is the most complete ruin of a Cistercian abbey in Britain. Studley Royal is an eighteenth century garden designed by John and William Aislabie and is



situated in the Skell Valley, with elegant ornamental lakes, tumbling cascades and temples. The site covers 800 acres and there is a deer park, mill, church and many paths and follies to explore. There is a visitor centre with a restaurant and two further cafes on the site where you can buy lunch, or you can bring your own picnic.

The cost of this day visit is £34.05 for non-National Trust members and £17.90 for National Trust members; this includes coach travel, driver's gratuity, entrance and tour of the Abbey. National Trust members must bring their membership card.

Please note: the ground is uneven and can be slippery in wet weather and you are advised to wear walking shoes and bring weather proof clothing in case of rain. There is a steep path between the entrance and the Abbey.

Visit to the Cotswolds and Beyond September 11th - 15th 2022

We are staying at the 4* Alexandra House Hotel a modern hotel in its own grounds four miles from Swindon. The rooms are well equipped and there is a swimming pool.

On our journey there we visit the Royal Shakespeare Company in Stratford for a behind the scenes tour which will take us backstage to explore the public and private areas. We will be given an insight into production and the history of the R.S.C The afternoon will be spent at leisure in this historic town. You could have a boat ride on the river. We continue our journey to our hotel, arriving early evening.

Day 2 begins with a visit to Highclere Castle, home to the Carnarvon family since 1679, the 6th Earl with Howard Carter discovered the tomb of Tutankhamun. More recently it is the location of Downton Abbey. We continue to Kintbury to enjoy a leisurely horse drawn canal ride along the Kennet and Avon Canal.

The next day we meet our local guide for a full day tour of the Cotswolds market towns and picturesque villages. We continue to Moreton in Marsh to visit the Motor Museum. The day finishes with a steam train ride from Toddington to Cheltenham

On Day 4 we travel to the UNESCO world heritage site of Bath to visit the famous Roman Baths. The afternoon will be spent at leisure in this beautiful city with its many interesting sights

We board the coach on our final day to begin our return journey to Sheffield. On route we visit the University City of Oxford for independent exploration.

The cost for this holiday is £549 per person sharing a room with a single supplement of £91. This includes a full English Breakfast, an evening table d'hote meal of 3 courses with 3 choices and coffee or tea. All travel, admission to places we visit and guided tours are included in the price


The Friday Lecture Programme: Back to the Future?

Stamford and the Open Air Theatre Saturday 16 July 2022: Hay Fever



For July 2022 the Weekenders team invite you to join us at the Rutland Open Air Theatre to see a matinée performance of Noel Coward's *Hay Fever* performed by the Stamford Shakespeare Company on their open-air stage set in beautiful grounds.

A cross between high farce and a comedy of manners, *Hay Fever* is one of Noel Coward's most durable comedies, continuing to delight audiences with its astute observations on family relationships and rivalries. The action takes place in the house of the Bliss family over the course of a weekend and the Bliss family member's, have all privately invited guests for the weekend, unbeknownst to anyone else. As the guests arrive, it becomes clear that it is not them who will be the problem, but the family themselves. As the weekend wears on, each guest pairs off with the wrong person with dramatic effects. Confused and angered by the strange behaviour of their hosts, the guests all agree that they must leave straight away! *Hay Fever* provides a shrewd, farcical look at a dysfunctional family oblivious to their ill-mannered behaviour.

All the seats in the theatre are under cover and no performance is cancelled because of rain. (A T loop is available for anyone hard of hearing.) There will be free time in Stamford to have lunch and wander around this interesting little town before attending the performance. The cost of the trip is £36 per person which includes the coach fare, theatre ticket and the driver's gratuity.
