

Why Book Online? You know you have a place immediately. You save two stamps! You save the organiser a lot of work.

How to Book Online:

- 1. Login at https://su3a.wildapricot.org using your email address and password.
- 2. If you have forgotten your password click on the 'Forgot password' link, next to the Login button.
- 3. If your email address does not work, email *wa-admin su3a.org.uk* for help.
- 4. Once logged in, click on 'Events' in the big blue menu bar.
- 5. Select the event you want and follow the online instructions.
- 6. To book for 2 or more people at once, complete the booking form for the first person. BEFORE paying go back and book the next person. You will need to know the email address that person uses to log in to Wild Apricot. Repeat this as needed. When you pay, all the booking fees will be taken from the one credit/debit card.

Events can still be applied for via the application forms in Links.

Friday 16 October

Political Culture and the Development of the 'Commonweal' in 16th Century England. Cathy Shrank, Professor of Tudor and Renaissance Literature, University of Sheffield.

Whilst Henry VIII's quest for a male heir led to religious and political instability, in fact, this time was also one of peace and expansion into the New World. Professor Cathy Shrank will examine how the establishment of a "Commonweal", especially in the reign of Elizabeth I, improved the lives of her subjects and strengthened the nation. With great personal sacrifice, this much studied Queen, strove to give happiness, health and safety and a common good to the ordinary people of her nation.



Friday 20 November The Battle of Waterloo - What happened Next?

Professor Bruce Collins, Sheffield Hallam University.



Recent media coverage has focused mainly on the battle itself. In this lecture Professor Bruce Collins will talk about the impact and legacy, from Napoleon's fall to the return of the Bonapartes, 1815-1848. We're sure we will learn many interesting, and possibly not

Alsace and the European Parliament 9th-13th May 2016



This 5 day, 4 night holiday is an ideal way to become acquainted with the Alsace region of France and Germany, as well as the European Parliament. The holiday includes: all travel by coach and air between Sheffield and Basel (including 1 x 20kg checked baggage and seat reservations), private midi-coach transportation

throughout the tour in France/Germany, 3 nights half board and 1 night bed & breakfast, 1 x 3 course dinner in Strasbourg on day 2 (excluding drinks) and all entrance fees outside of those you may visit during free time, tips and gratuities (except for the hotel which is left to the individual's discretion). Accommodation is at the 3 star Superior Best Western Hotel in Rastatt.

We also spend a day in Strasbourg that includes a pre-booked tour of the European Parliament hosted by an MEP and it may also include the opportunity to observe a live debate from the "visitor's gallery". There will be free time to explore this fascinating medieval city with its stunning Cathedral which houses 17th Century tapestries and perhaps visit the popular **Astronomical Clock**.

During our holiday we also visit **Obernai**, the second most visited town in the Alsace, with its traditional half-timbered houses; the **Castle of Haut-Koengsberg** with its inn, forge and mill in the lower courtyard (some steps to be negotiated); the **Lalique Museum**; the city of **Colmar** where we enjoy a petit train tour of this city preserved from the Middle Ages highlighting churches, cloisters and facades with ornate wood sculptures, before leaving for the airport and our return flight.

Travel Group Short Break to Northern Ireland 23 – 28 April 2016

Belfast, Northern Ireland's capital city, is now a thriving modern metropolis. It has a colourful history and was a key player in the Industrial Revolution. This is our base for the spring break in and around the city. We will travel to Northern Ireland by coach to Holyhead in Anglesey, board the ferry to Dublin, and then go back on the coach for about 2 hours to Belfast. Quite a long day, but well worth it! The return journey will be slightly shorter as we will be travelling on the fast ferry from Dublin to Holyhead.

Our programme will include a visit to Springhill House (NT), a 17th century "Plantation" home, described as one of the prettiest houses in Ulster. The highlight here is the celebrated costume collection dating from the 18th century to the 1930's. At Wellbrook (NT), the last working water-powered beetling mill in N.I., we can experience the pounding of the linen to make it less porous, and enjoy hands-on demonstrations. There will also be a Belfast City tour and a visit to the "Titanic experience" to uncover the remarkable story of the Titanic, the world's most famous ship. At the Giant's Causeway World Heritage Site (NT), we can see the extraordinary geometric columns formed as a result of volcanic activity over 60 million years ago. Whisky Lovers will enjoy a tour of the famous Bushmills distillery nearby! The return journey to Belfast will be on the Antrim Coast road, often described as one of the most beautiful coastal routes in the world, the drive of your life! At Downpatrick, we will also follow the story of St. Patrick, Ireland's Patron Saint. No trip to Northern Ireland would be complete without a visit to Hillsborough, a real showpiece Georgian village, including a tour of Hillsborough Castle, the Queen's official residence.

The cost for this **5 night/6 day** break is **£460** per person with a single supplement of **£75**. We are staying at Corr's Corner Hotel at Newtownabbey. The hotel has all the usual facilities.

The cost covers bed, breakfast and evening meal at the hotel, transport throughout by Walter Martin, ferry crossings, all gratuities and admission fees, except those of the 3 National Trust properties (approx. £16). Lunches, snacks and any other refreshments (unless stated) are not included.


Cape Wrath Trail Challenge
