COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Members of the General Committee are the legal trustees of the organisation. They are accountable under Charity law (any decision to convert to a company limited by guarantee would widen this responsibility to include the provisions of company law). Collectively and individually, they carry the ultimate responsibility, under the legislation, for the work of the Committee, and of any staff, on behalf of the organisation. The responsibility is a collective one and the approach to the tasks involved should be in a collaborative form.

As a large percentage of the work carried out by Committee Members is via email, members must have internet access and be comfortable collaborating via email.

Responsibilities:

- Contribute to the task of identifying and setting strategic goals for the organisation
- Work with the other Committee members in achieving the strategic goals of the organisation
- Maintain a collective overview of the organisation's activity and practice
- Take opportunities to raise the profile of the organisation and its work in all appropriate arenas
- Contribute to the public understanding of the organisation
- Attend Committee meetings on a regular basis. (Failure to attend three consecutive meetings without good reason will result in membership of the Committee lapsing)
- Undertake tasks in relation to specific areas of the organisation's work by taking on a specific role or task or through membership of at least one committee or working group on specific issues.
