

Local Heritage Listing

We are delighted to learn that South Yorkshire has been successful in receiving Government funding to expand its list of heritage assets that contribute to the distinctiveness and history of South Yorkshire but are not so far protected by statutory designations. Any building, place or site's listed status must be taken into account in planning applications that could affect it. These could be historic buildings, monuments, archaeological sites, parks and gardens, historic landscapes or any other heritage assets that are significant.

This is a great opportunity for Sheffield u3a members to put forward buildings or places which they believe should have listed status and therefore protection into the future. We hope you agree and will get involved where you can - as an existing u3a group, a smaller group, or as an individual. With your permission we will put people and groups who are interested in similar themes or areas in touch with each other.

Assets you nominate will be assessed against a number of approved criteria and added to the Local List if appropriate. Assets which don't make it onto the list will still be used to enrich the Historic Environment Record (HER) for Sheffield.

Sheffield u3a is organising a workshop in January 2022 where you can hear more about the project and meet Sarah Cattell who is the lead for South Yorkshire Local Heritage Listing.
