

## South Yorkshire Heritage List - Update

The project lead Sarah Cattell (sarah.cattell@sheffield.gov.uk) has sent us this update:

'I'm pleased to say that things are going well with the Local Heritage List at the moment and we have just finished the second round of nomination assessments. As a result, there are 67 historic places in Sheffield recommended for inclusion on the list, along with over 30 which will be assessed in the next round next month. These are currently open for public consultation, so if any u3a members have any comments to make on these places, we'd love to hear from them. As the nomination and assessment process runs in cycles, there is no set deadline for nominations to be received, so please encourage everyone to keep nominating places they would like to see protected. We have also made good progress with the formal adoption of the local list with Sheffield Council, who approved the project at their March Co-Operative Executive meeting. This means that the South Yorkshire List has been adopted as the Local Heritage List for Sheffield with delegated responsibility for the ongoing approval of subsequent candidates to the Head of Planning, so new places can be added any time.

I've been in contact with quite a few people about nominations they have either submitted or planned to submit but it's always nice to speak to more people, so folks are still welcome to get in touch with me any time about getting involved, as my contract has now been extended until the end of September.

The nominations we've have had been generally very good, the only thing I've had to remind people of is to make sure they put information in at least 5 of the 7 criteria boxes on the nomination form, as to be included an asset needs a positive score in at least 5 of them. Otherwise, the only other feedback to u3a members is keep up the good work!'
