Travel Audio System

To further enhance the tours where guides are used, Su3a have invested in the Whisper Audio System. Basically, you are provided with a small receiver (about the size of a pack of cards) which you wear around your neck. This has an earpiece attached. The guide wears a transmitter with a microphone and talks normally. Through your earpiece, you can hear the guide up to 70 metres away.

Ideal for those city walks or when visiting country houses and churches. For those with hearing aids with a 'T' switch, loop receivers are available. Just let the organiser know in advance.

Your tour organiser will let you know if these will be used on your excursion.

FRIDAY LECTURES

Held at the Showroom Cinema

If you weren't at our December lecture you missed out on a great speaker.....

You also missed out on some very tasty mince pies! Our Speaker was Neal Hanson, author of over 70 books, ghost writer to the stars and one-time landlord of the Tan Hill Pub, the highest pub in England and famous for its starring role with Ted Moult in an Everest Double Glazing ad (only those of a certain age may remember it). Neal took us on a light-hearted romp through the vicissitudes of owning the country's most remote and dilapidated inn; on one occasion, being snowed in from December until early March, on another, being told by the local planning department to remove the free of charge double glazed windows and reinstate the old ones. It had taken Neil months of haggling with Everest to get all the windows for free but unfortunately, despite its dilapidated state the inn was Grade 2 listed. Lucky for him that the old windows had fallen into pieces during removal and he had burned any remaining wood for Winter fuel. The planners saw sense.

By contrast **our November lecture** tackled a more sobering subject, the world of **fraud, cyber crime and scams.** We saw case studies from S. Yorks Police where it became clear that phone scams in particular, target older people.

Advice from the Police - Always be on the alert if you are asked for money, gift vouchers or personal information whether it be on the phone, by email or even by a text supposedly from a family member using their own or someone else's mobile phone.

Never assume that someone is telling the truth.

Never believe what they say unless you are confident that they are who they say they are and always independently confirm the details they have provided.

Did you know that most UK banks now subscribe to a generic phone number? If you want to check that a phone call supposedly coming from your bank is genuine, hang up on the call, use another phone if possible otherwise wait 5 minutes then **dial 159** and ask to be put through to your own bank for verification. If your bank is not part of the scheme use the number shown on the back of your bank card or on your bank statement.

Coach tour of the Italian Lakes 6th – 13th September 2024

Malton Food Lovers Festival and Eden WW11 Camp Sunday 26th May 2024

"Yorkshire's Foodie Glastonbury" is back!

Set across the streets of Yorkshire's Food Capital, **Malton Food Lovers Festival** is a celebration of Yorkshire's finest produce & cooking.



Expect artisan stalls, delicious street food, talks, tastings, celebrity chefs, demos, festival bar, live music & much, much more! Malton's family

foodie extravaganza is a festival like no other. A giant celebration, a huge gourmet street party.



Eden Camp Modern History Museum is a family owned and run business that started over 30 years ago.

Originally a prisoner of war camp, it was built on an agricultural plot on the outskirts of Malton in early 1942, by a small contingent of army personnel who had travelled from Castle Douglas, Scotland.

At its peak, Eden Camp's 45 huts were supplemented by a large area of tented accommodation and could house around 1200 prisoners at any one time.



Now each hut covers a different aspect of the war, starting with the rise of the Nazi Party, Hitler and The Outbreak of War. Other topics include: Rationing, the Utility Scheme, 'Save It' Campaigns, Evacuees, Propaganda, Home Guard, Home Front, The Blitz, Air Raid and Gas Precautions, Animals at War, The Street at War, Women at War, The Land Army and Timber Girls, The Munition Factories, The

Observer Corps, The Auxiliary Fire Service, The WVS, The Red Cross, Civil Defence, The Rescue Services, The Bevin Boys, etc.

There is something for everyone!

Our coach will take us first to Malton to enjoy a festival of Yorkshire Food. Here you can wander around tasting food, watching chefs at work, and generally enjoying the sound and sights of this picturesque market town. Early afternoon, our coach will take us to Eden Camp where we can immerse ourselves into the social history of life in Britain from 1939 to 1945.

The cost for this exiting day out is £37, which includes the hire of the coach, the visit to Malton Food Lovers Festival, entry to Eden Camp and all gratuities. To book your place please complete the form below:

The History & Heritage of Hampshire 13th-17th June 2024

The Travel Group invite you to join us on a trip exploring some of the History and Heritage of Hampshire

This 5 day, 4 night trip includes private executive coach throughout our journey and 4 nights half board accommodation at the **4*** **Hampshire Court Hotel** (www.thehampshirecourthotel.co.uk) on the outskirts of **Basingstoke**. Facilities at the hotel include a restaurant, bar, indoor swimming pool, gymnasium, sauna and a steam room.

On our way down to Basingstoke we will visit the National Trust's **Waddesdon Manor** in Buckinghamshire. The French Renaissance-style chateau was built for **Ferdinand de Rothschild** in the 19th century to display his vast collection of works of art, including French royal furniture, Sèvres porcelain and works by **Gainsborough** and **Reynolds**.

During the next few days we will take in: the **Great Hall** in Winchester and enjoy a guided tour at **Winchester Cathedral** with free time in the city followed by a visit to **Jane Austen's House Museum in Chawton**,the renowned author spent the last eight years of her life, and where she wrote some of her most popular works.

Stonehenge and Salisbury, a great stone circle and an exceptional survivor from lost prehistoric cultures, begun around 3000 BC in the late Stone Age, this unique monument evolved until about 1600 BC in the mid Bronze Age. With free time in Salisbury where you may choose to visit the National Trust's **Mompesson House**, or **Salisbury**



Cathedral, a beautiful historic building, an international symbol of Christianity and a world class heritage attraction. Our final full day will see us at the **Historic Dockyard in Portsmouth**. We will have a pass for the day to look around the site at our own individual pace. Some of the highlights you may wish to explore are: **The HMS Victory** stands today as the world's oldest commissioned warship and has seen over 220 years of almost continuous naval service.

Or perhaps the HMS Warrior 1860 was launched during a period of uneasy peace between Britain and her traditional enemy, France. During her heyday she was the most formidable warship the world has ever seen. Alternatively you may wish to



explore the new **Mary Rose Museum**'s interior evolved from the frozen moment in time seconds before Henry VIII's flagship sank on a fine summer day on 19 July 1545 as she sailed into action against the French fleet. The excavation and raising of the Mary Rose uncovered and lifted an extraordinary collection of Tudor maritime life. When she capsized onto her starboard side, she along

with tens of thousands of objects quickly settled beneath layers of protecting silts in the Solent. This provided a time capsule of the ship, her fittings, weaponry and armament, and all the possessions of her 500 crew and soldiers from the Admiral to the common sailor

After checking out of our hotel on the final day and en route back to Sheffield we will visit the National Trust's **Upton House and Gardens** in Warwickshire, a country mansion containing an outstanding collection of English and continental old master paintings including works by Hogarth, Canaletto, Brueghel and El Greco.

The cost is £650.00pp with a £119.00 single supplement, subject to minimum numbers being met. All gratuities for coach driver, hotel and guides are also included. Please note for non National Trust members there will be additional entrance costs at Waddesdon Manor and Upton House and Gardens

All applicants should have their own travel insurance. Su3a cannot be responsible for any claims. This tour is arranged by Tailored Travel who provide travel insurance if needed.

Stamford and the Open Air Theatre Saturday 24 August 2024



The Weekenders' team cordially invite you to our annual outing to The Open Air Theatre and Stamford. This year the matinee performance is Jane Austen's Sense and Sensibility performed by the Stamford Shakespeare Company at their open-air stage set in the beautiful grounds of Tolethorpe Hall

Sense and Sensibility is Jane Austen's first novel published anonymously in 1811. It is the story of the Dashwood sisters, Elinor (19) and Marianne (16) as they come of age. There is an older half-brother, John, and a younger sister, Margaret (13). The novel follows the 3 Dashwood sisters and their widowed mother as they are forced to leave the family estate Norland Park and move to the Barton Cottage. The novel is set in South-West England, London and Sussex, probably between 1792 – 1795.

In an attempt to avoid the heat of the previous years, Tolethorpe Hall's matinee performances commences at 11.30am. We will therefore make our way to the theatre first for 11.00am and following the performance we will be taken to Stamford for members to have a late lunch (or picnic) and wander round this lovely little town. The cost of the trip is **£42.00** per person which includes the coach fare, theatre ticket and the driver's gratuity. Places are limited so if you would like to join us, please complete the application form and return it along with your payment asap (**no later than 19th April**)

There is also an **optional** guided walking tour of Stamford of about an hour's duration costing **£8** per head. Please indicate if you wish to do this and so the total price for the trip and tour is **£50**. There will be plenty of time as we will be leaving Stamford at about 6pm.
