


Biddulph Grange and Little Moreton Hall

Wednesday 24 June 2026

This visit will take us to Staffordshire and Cheshire to see two National Trust Properties which will appeal to both gardening and history enthusiasts. Our first stop will be the Biddulph Grange Garden which was extensively restored by the National Trust when they acquired it in 1988.



Designed by James and Maria Bateman the gardens encapsulate many different regions of the world including a Scottish Glen, a beautiful Chinese Garden with pavilions and bridge. Ancient Egypt features in another garden and there are surprises around every corner, hidden from sight by tall evergreen hedges or tunnels. Keen geologists will also be interested in the Geological Gallery housing a wide range of fossils and rocks. There is a National Trust Café on site where members can purchase drinks, snacks and light meals, picnics are not allowed on site. It's important to note that access to parts of the site are **very limited** in places as the garden is built on the side of a valley and has many steep and narrow paths and over 400 steps.



After lunch we will take the coach to Little Moreton Hall a short distance away in Cheshire. Here members will be able to visit the hall which is a moated half-timbered manor house dating from 1504 with additions in the ensuing century. There is a magnificent long gallery which runs along the upper floor, and many other original and quirky features including windows, chimney pieces and wood panelling. Once part of a huge and profitable estate, the gardens are all that remain and these have been restored to replicate a garden in the Tudor period. Facilities include a small café where drinks and snacks can be purchased.



FRIDAY LECTURES

Our speaker at the December lecture was David Harmer. David is a poet, children's author and together with Ian MacMillan was a founder member of the Circus of Poets. For a number of years he performed at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival as one half of the "Glummer Twins". David regaled us with stories from his life, starting with this family's move from Bromley in Kent to Mexborough as a young teenager and how this came as something of a culture shock. His time at Mexborough Grammar School imbued him with a love of poetry and he was not alone, school mate Ian McMillan, Tony Capstick a few years ahead of him and Ted Hughes and Harold Massingham were both alumni of the school. His stories were interspersed with his poetry, all of it humorous and based on life events from buying a new car to swimming in the North Sea on holidays with the kids. His homage to Scandi Noir drama "Hi, Hi, Tac, Tac, Absolut!" was greeted with much laughter by those in the audience familiar with the genre and we've had a number of requests for a return session from David.

By the time this edition of the Links Open Group Supplement is in print we will have had the first of our 2026 lectures which featured Su3a members David Keeble and Professor Aidan While demonstrating how AI could help us in everyday life.

20th February

February's talk will be given by Katherine Hardwick-Kulpa, Assistant Curator of the Chatsworth House Trust. Katherine will be telling us about how the 1st Duke of Devonshire built Chatsworth.

20th March

Then in March, Derek Bacon who last year did a very well received talk about Gaudi & Barcelona will be looking at the life and works of Picasso, an artist who divides opinion. Perhaps Derek will manage to get us all onside?



Walking the Hebridean Way Friday Lecture 19 November 2025

A large Showroom audience heard a very interesting, informative and entertaining talk by Rachel Firth on walking the Hebridean Way. Rachel and her walking friend, Hilary White, who unfortunately was unable to join Rachel for the talk, have completed several long distance walks in recent years. Their most recent walk, the Hebridean Way, a nationally recognised long walk of 175 miles, covers the 10 islands from Vatersay in the south to the much larger island of Lewis in the north and which are connected by a series of ferries, causeways or narrow roads. Most visitors see the islands by car or, increasingly as cyclists and Rachel and Hilary came across very few other walkers following the same route as themselves, some days seeing no-one else all day. Whilst most paths are marked, walkers should be aware that this is not always the case, particularly in the boggy areas so certain navigation and map-reading skills are required.


Both Sheffield geography graduates and keen photographers, Rachel and Hilary were particularly interested in the geology, the varied landscapes from mountain ranges to large areas of boggy, peat moorland, white sandy beaches, freshwater lochs, the varied plant and wild life and perhaps most importantly of all for themselves as walkers, the ever changing weather patterns of the islands. Weather conditions in the Outer Hebrides are famously changeable and all four seasons are frequently experienced in one day.

Walkers have a variety of places for overnight accommodation from hostels, self-catering cottages, hotels, croft cottages, bunkhouses, bothies or even camping. More practically, Rachel acknowledged that their walk, undertaken in stages over 2 years, would not have been possible without their 'sherpa', a friend who carried their back packs, food, spare boots and essential dry clothes etc in her van and who took care of their meals when they were self-catering.

Rachel's talk was illustrated by a large number of photographs, maps and other information on the landscapes, geology and history of the islands, remote beaches, sweeping eagles, rare plants and mosses, as well as factual, practical information for anyone planning a similar walk.

Having finally completed their long-held ambition to complete the Hebridean Way, plans are already afoot for their next long walk, possibly along the NE coast of the UK.

made around the year 1300. It is made on a single sheet of vellum measuring 5'2" x 4'7" and shows the history, geography of the world as it was understood in Christian Europe at the time.



The highlight of the tour is a full day at The Royal Welsh Show, one of the countries great agricultural shows, showcasing the very best of Wales and the UK. Set in the hills surrounding Builth Wells, The Royal Welsh Show provides something to interest everyone through its wide range of livestock classes, attracting more than 7,500 entries from across Wales, the UK and the rest of Europe, as well as activities including forestry, horticulture, crafts, countryside sports, food and drink, trade stands and a 12-hour programme each day of exciting entertainment, attractions and displays.



During our return journey, we enjoy a river cruise and take in the glorious sites, best seen while gently cruising along the water. Relax and take in the views as the world drifts by. You'll also be treated to an afternoon tea, the perfect way to round off our day before returning to Sheffield.

The Vibrant Cities of Andalucia

6-13 October 2026

Join us for a **two 4* hotel** stay (**Jerez** and **Antequera**) to uncover the enchanting landscapes, timeless traditions and vibrant cities of **Andalucia**. We will explore iconic landmarks such as the **Alhambra** and the **Cathedral of Seville**, savor authentic tapas, experiencing passionate flamenco performance and visit a traditional sherry wine cellar.

We will begin our exploration of the region with **Seville** and a guided walking tour in **Santa Cruz** and a visit to the cathedral with half the day free to explore and shop this iconic city independently. The following day we explore **Jerez** visiting a **carriage museum** followed by a visit to the world famous **Andalucian Horse Show** we will also have a tapas menu lunch in the local winery followed by **sherry wine tasting**. National Memorial Arboretum

Wednesday 3rd June 2026

A visit is planned to the National Memorial Arboretum in Alrewas, Staffordshire. It is the Nation's year-round place to remember, a special place that honours those who have served and continue to serve our Nation. People from all walks of life are represented, with memorials dedicated to the Armed Forces, Emergency Services and civilian organisations.



The Arboretum has over 400 memorials, 25,000 trees and an abundance of wildlife set in peaceful woodlands, colourful gardens and riverside walks.

The visit will start with the opportunity to attend the daily act of remembrance followed by a short talk on "The Arboretum, Past, Present and Future".

We will then board the land train which will allow you to see the splendour of the Arboretum from the comfort of a covered land train with an accompanying 50-minute pre-recorded commentary.



This will be followed by a two course, table served, hot lunch with tea and coffee. Additional drinks can be purchased. There will then be free time for you to do more exploring before we leave at about 4pm.
